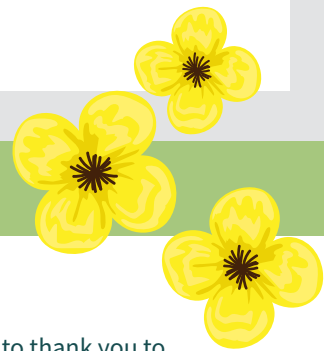


CLINICAL CORNER

Why is infection control important? In a care environment, it is important that we have the skills to identify and manage situations where illnesses could be spread and taking action to mitigate the risks. In these trying and ever changing times, it is critical to be able to plan and respond to any potential situations that comes our way. As part of a federal government initiative, infection control courses are being offered to ensure that we will be better prepared to prevent and respond to any infection diseases. At Rosewood, we currently have two nurses that are taking on this challenge – Pauline Tan and Sandra Passmore.

They will be undertaking a specialised infection control course over the upcoming weeks. Pauline and Sandra will be trained to work with the most updated infection prevention and control programs that can be integrated with our current policies and procedures. They are due to finish at the end of February and will be the core of our infection control team.
